- Plan your future:** Get the insights you need to guide your professional development and career path.



CCHI's Language Access Advocate, Jorge U. Ungo, has been actively participating in the newly formed **National Coalition for Language Access (NCFLA)**, a diverse alliance of interpreters, advocates, educators, healthcare professionals, and legal experts united in defense of communication access.

Formed on March 2, 2025, following the release of Executive Order 14224, which designated English as the national language of the United States, the coalition brings together hearing, Deaf, and Deafblind members, both multilingual and monolingual, immigrants and U.S.-born allies.

Together, they share one purpose: to educate and advocate for the rights of individuals with limited English proficiency or who are Deaf, Deafblind, or hard of hearing, ensuring that everyone in our multilingual nation can communicate clearly and access essential services in healthcare, education, social services, and beyond.
