



### An idiom is

#### Merriam Webster:



An expression in the usage of a language that is peculiar to itself, either in having meaning that cannot be derived from the conjoined meanings of its elements (such as up in the air for "undecided) or in its gramatically atypical use of words (such as, give way)

#### Oxford:



A group of words established by usage as having a meaning not deducible from those of the individual words (e.g., rain cats and dogs, see the light)

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#### My English Pages:

An idiom (also called idiomatic expression) is an expression, word or phrase that has a figurative meaning conventionally understood by native speakers.

This meaning is different from the literal meaning of the idiom's individual elements. In other words,

idioms dont mean exactly what the words say.



























